Students will visit the Newseum, the National Museum of the American Indian, the National Zoo, and other national landmarks during the summer camp. The goal is to have fun while using multiple modalities to share what is seen, heard, felt and learned during camp experiences. Students will use oral storytelling, persuasive journalism, and short videos or slide presentations communicate with the larger community. Parents and community members will be invited to view final presentations at the conclusion of camp.
